# Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners,

Every summer we, as a Parish, participate in **THE MISSIONARY COOPERATION PLAN OF THE Diocese**. This means that we invite in a speaker who has been or is serving the work of the Church in some foreign land: like Latin America, Asia or Africa.

Today we welcome Fr. Bill Boteler from the Maryknoll Fathers who has served many years in Latin America and was then Superior of the Maryknoll Order as well. We will be taking up a collection for the work of the **MARYKNOLL** Order.

The name **MARYKNOLL** is a “nickname” for the **CATHOLIC FOREIGN MISSION SOCIETY OF THE UNITED STATES**. The name comes from the “knoll” on which the seminary for this society is built in New York that is dedicated to (guess who?) Mary. **Just as Mary brought Jesus to the suffering world; so also Maryknoll missionaries continue to do so today!** It was founded by Bishop James Walsh in the early 1900’s and has sent many priests from this country to do mission work throughout the world. Most recently since the Vatican Council, it has accepted and trained many Catholic laity (individuals and families) to be part of their missionary work.

One of their most well-known publications is **Maryknoll Magazine** that, monthly, writes the stories and experiences of these missionaries for the rest of us to be aware of their work. It is a great little magazine and it helped formed the imagination and commitment of many of us over the years to the Priesthood and to an awareness of the missionary nature of the Church. For myself and my generation of priests, we all had great admiration for the work and the sacrifice of these priests and pray for their continued effectiveness.

We also hope and pray that the witness of their generous response to Christ will touch young people today to consider “**a call from Christ in your lives.**”

**The Second Collection today will be for the continuing work of Maryknoll in our time!**

**One word about the Gospel: It’s a wonderful Gospel.** It tells the story of the man who is seeking “eternal life;” Jesus responds with the story of the Good Samaritan; and then Jesus challenges him and us: “**Go and do the same!**” One of the important teachings in this Gospel today is: **If you ask the right questions of Christ and the Church, you are going to get tough answers!**

- ♦ There is no faith without the cross;
- ♦ There is no eternal life without dying to self and selfishness;
- ♦ There is no salvation without service to others!
- ♦ **There is no such thing as an easy and comfortable Christianity.**

How is that for an invitation to come and follow Jesus?

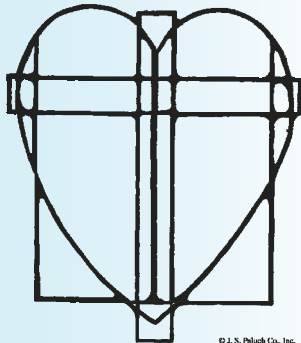

## Vivan la ley del amor

Queridos hermanos y hermanas,

Hoy encontramos en el evangelio de Lucas una gran parábola, pero antes de seguir adelante aclaremos primero la pregunta. ¿Qué es una parábola? **Parábola es una narración simbólica de la que se saca una enseñanza**, son historias que Jesús inventaba usando cosas y elementos de la vida cotidiana de cualquier persona (por ejemplo la parábola del *Hijo Pródigo*) o a veces Jesús usaba elementos de la naturaleza como por ejemplo la parábola del *Sembrador* y en todas esas historias Jesús dejaba una enseñanza.

Ahora bien, aclarado esto pasemos a la parábola de hoy llamada parábola del **Buen Samaritano**, (recomiendo como siempre que lean la historia de hoy en casa y luego esta explicación para que se entienda mejor, la historia la encuentran en Lucas 10,25-37) la historia de hoy nos deja como mensaje que **amar al prójimo es algo que nos afecta incondicionalmente**, por ejemplo, amar al prójimo nada tiene que ver con el hecho de si el prójimo se lo merece o no, de hecho Jesús recomienda incluso amar al enemigo. Amar a todos, buenos, malos, lo merezcan o no lo merezcan es un desafío que Jesús nos presenta.

En la parábola del buen samaritano, Jesús también *presupone una posibilidad y le da alas*: no pretende mandar amar, sino describir *el amor al prójimo como cosa posible* y con ello hacerlo verdaderamente posible en nuestra vida.

Amar al prójimo incondicionalmente es posible, solo tenemos que animarnos.

### LITURGICAL CATECHESIS

As a parish, we pray for the special needs of our community, including the sick and those who have recently died. At our weekday masses, we pray for special intentions, assigned by our office staff by arrangement with donors who wish to reserve a mass intention. At our Sunday masses, we pray for the intentions of the whole community, expressed in the appropriately named *Prayer of the Faithful*. From our community's public prayer, it is an easy segue into prayer in general. Either Saint Francis or Saint Anthony expressed my personal style of prayer with this quip: Preach the gospel always. When necessary, use words. My personal prayer is action, the action of providing the physical needs for worship, the ministers, the décor, the atmosphere of prayer. Beyond my official ministry here, I am involved in Jesus' call for justice. Sometimes this is working at Saint Joseph's or the Lord's Table. Sometimes this is registering voters. Sometimes this is voicing a Catholic position in a letter to the editor. Sometimes it means helping someone get to mass. Further, I work in our catechumenate ministry, helping people to become Catholic.

Many people use our church's beautiful set prayers: the Liturgy of the Hours (Office), the Rosary, Stations of the Cross, Angelus. A dedicated core of people makes the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament a regular part of the prayer life of our parish.

Still others turn to regular retreats to nourish their spiritual life.

The depth and breadth of styles of prayer still cannot approach the depth and breadth of the One who hears our prayer. As we often say at mass, He hears our prayers, spoken and kept deep in our hearts. Though God knows what the nature of our prayer is before we even formulate it, we find great spiritual satisfaction in forming and expressing our prayer, in word, song, and action. Whatever your chosen style or styles of prayer, do pray. Archbishop Quinn suggests spending an hour in prayer everyday, to find the peace and strength to go on in our troubled world. Peace be with you!
